Session Resumed After Recess.

On Monday, May 2, 1983, at 2:00 P.M., the City Council reassembled with Honorable Harold Washington, Mayor, in the Chair. Honorable Walter S. Kozubowski, City Clerk, called the roll of members and it was found that there were present at the time: Aldermen Roti, Rush, Kenner, Evans, Bloom, Beavers, Vrdolyak, Huels, Majerczyk, Madrzyk, Burke, Brady, Langford, Streeter, Kellam, Sheahan, Kelley, Stemberk, Krystyniak, Marzullo, Nardulli, W. Quorum present.

Invocation.

Reverend Herbert Martin, Sr., Progressive Community Church, opened the meeting with prayer.

At this point in the proceedings, Honorable Harold Washington recognized Alderman Natarus, who moved that the City Council do Adjourn. Various aldermen requested a roll call vote on the motion. After asking a verbal response on the motion, Mayor Washington declared the City Council adjourned and left the chambers.

Alderman Vrdolyak, joined by other aldermen, requested the Clerk take a roll call vote on the motion to Adjourn.

Upon the calling of the roll, the motion to adjourn *Failed to Pass* by yeas and nays as follows:

Temporary Presiding Officer Appointed.

Alderman Burke then presented the following motion, seconded by Alderman Stemberk:

"I move that Alderman Edward R. Vrdolyak be elected as the temporary presiding officer of the City Council in the absence of the Mayor, until such time as the Council elects a President Pro Tempore."

The motion *Prevailed*, by yeas and nays as follows:

Thereupon Alderman Edward R. Vrdolyak assumed the Chair as temporary presiding officer of the City Council.

Adoption of Rules of Order Approved.

Alderman Burke (along with Aldermen Roti, Vrdolyak, Huels, Majerczyk, Madrzyk, Brady, Kellam, Sheahan, Stemberk, Krystyniak, Marzullo, Nardulli, Hagopian, Santiago, Gabinski, Mell, Banks, Damato, Cullerton, Laurino, O'Connor, Pucinski, Hansen, McLaughlin, Orbach, Schuller and Stone) presented the following proposed resolution, seconded by Alderman Pucinski:

Be It Resolved, By the City Council of the City of Chicago, that the Rules of Order of the City Council of 1979-1983, as previously adopted and in effect as of April 1, 1983, be adopted as the Rules of Order of the City Council of 1983-1987, with the following changes:

Rule 35 is changed to read as follows:

"RULE 35. The following shall be the standing committees of the City Council:

1. Committee on Administration, Reorganization and Personnel.
2. Committee on Aviation.
3. Committee on Beautification and Recreation.
4. Committee on Buildings.
5. Committee on Cable Television.
6. Committee on Claims and Liabilities.
7. Committee on Committees and Rules.
8. Committee on Cultural Development and Historical Landmark Preservation.
9. Committee on Economic Development.
10. Committee on Education.
11. Committee on Employment.
12. Committee on Energy and Environmental Protection.
13. Committee on Finance.
14. Committee on Health.
15. Committee on Housing and Neighborhood Development.
16. Committee on Human Rights and Consumer Protection.
17. Committee on Intergovernmental Relations.

18. Committee on Land Acquisition and Disposition.
19. Committee on Leases.
20. Committee on Licenses.
21. Committee on Streets and Alleys.
22. Committee on Local Transportation.
23. Committee on Municipal Code Revision.
24. Committee on Police, Fire and Municipal Institutions.
25. Committee on Ports, Wharves and Bridges.
26. Committee on Public Utilities.
27. Committee on Special Events and World's Fair.
28. Committee on Traffic Control and Safety.
29. Committee on Zoning."

Rule 36 is changed, in the second paragraph thereof, by revising said paragraph to read as follows:

"Aldermen shall be assigned to a maximum of nine (9) standing committees. The Committee on Finance shall have a maximum of thirty-four (34) members and all other committees shall have a maximum of fourteen (14) members. The Vice Mayor shall serve as an *ex officio* member of all standing committees and his membership shall be in addition to the aforementioned limitations."

Rule 36 is further changed by adding thereto the following:

"A committee may, by majority vote of its full membership, create a permanent or temporary subcommittee. The membership, chairmen and vice-chairmen of subcommittees shall be appointed by the Chairman of the parent committee. Subcommittee jurisdiction shall be determined by the parent committee, but may not exceed the jurisdiction of the parent committee. Subcommittees shall report to their parent committee, and may be discharged from consideration of any matter only by a majority vote of the full membership of the parent committee. Matters may be referred to a subcommittee by the parent committee, or by the Chairman of the parent committee.

Members, Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of committees may be removed only by resolution of the Council adopted by an affirmative vote of 2/3 of all the Aldermen entitled by law to be elected.

Special committees may be created by the Council only by resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the Aldermen entitled by law to be elected."

Rule 37 is changed to read as follows

"RULE 37. The jurisdiction of each standing committee, in terms of legislation and administrative activities of its particular concern, shall be as follows:

1. The *Committee on Administration, Reorganization and Personnel* shall have jurisdiction over all matters concerning the reorganization of the agencies, departments and offices of the City government; the elimination, consolidation or merger thereof; and transfers of powers and functions among them; transfers of powers, duties or functions between the City government and other governmental entities; and the efficiency and operation of departments, agencies and offices not within the jurisdiction of the other standing committees; personnel promotions, transfers, demotions

and discharges, career services and merit systems, seniority and competitive examinations, and the enforcement and protection of employees. The committee shall have jurisdiction over employee grievances, and the Department of Personnel.

2. The *Committee on Aviation* shall have jurisdiction over matters relating to aviation and airports.
3. The *Committee on Beautification and Recreation* shall have jurisdiction over matters relating to forestry and the provision of recreational facilities within the City and shall work with those agencies, both public and private that are similarly engaged in all matters relating to the Bureau of Forestry, Parkways and Beautification.
4. The *Committee on Buildings* shall have jurisdiction over building ordinances and matters generally affecting the Department of Inspectional Services.
5. The *Committee on Cable Television* shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to Cable Television regulation, contracts and franchises, and all other communication technologies over which the City has jurisdiction.
6. The *Committee on Claims and Liabilities* shall have jurisdiction over all pecuniary claims against the City or against funds under the custody of the City Treasurer, whether based on contract, tort, or statute other than Worker's Compensation Claims. The Committee shall review all such claims and report thereon to the Council. The Law Department and all other City officers and agencies shall promptly transmit to the committee all notices of claims against the City, and all law suits, demands, claims, and judgments involving pecuniary liabilities.
7. The *Committee on Committees and Rules* shall have jurisdiction over the Rules of Order and Procedure, the procedures of the Council and its committees, including disputes over committee jurisdiction and referrals, ward redistricting, elections and referenda, committee assignments, selection of City officers, the conduct of the council members, the provision of services to the City Council body, the City Clerk and Council service agencies including the City Council Legislative Reference Bureau.
8. The *Committee on Cultural Development and Historical Landmark Preservation* shall have jurisdiction over those matters which affect the cultural growth of the City and its cultural institutions, and the designation, maintenance and preservation of historical and architectural landmarks. The committee shall work in cooperation with those public and private organizations similarly engaged; and shall also have jurisdiction over matters generally affecting the Chicago Public Library, the Chicago Council of Fine Arts and the Commission on Chicago Historical and Architectural Landmarks.
9. The *Committee on Economic Development* shall have jurisdiction over those matters which directly affect the economic expansion, development of the City and economic attraction to the City, and shall work with those public or private organizations that are similarly engaged, and matters generally affecting the Economic Development Commission.
10. The *Committee on Education* shall have jurisdiction over matters generally related to the education of the citizens of the City of Chicago and matters generally affecting the Chicago Board of Education and Junior College District No. 508.
11. The *Committee on Employment* shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to employment practices and policies, including hiring.

12. The *Commission on Energy and Environmental Protection* shall have jurisdiction over all orders, ordinances and resolutions relating to the abatement of air, water and noise pollution; solid waste collection and disposal, recycling and reuse of wastes, conservation of natural resources and with all other matters not specifically included dealing with the improvement of the quality of the environment and the conservation of energy.
13. The *Committee on Finance* shall have jurisdiction over the City budget, tax levies, industrial revenue bonds, general obligation bonds and revenue bond programs, revenue and expenditure orders, ordinances and resolutions, the financing of municipal services and capital developments; and matters generally affecting the Budget office, the Department of Finance; and the solicitation of funds for charitable or other purposes on the streets and other public places. The Committee shall have jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to the audit and review of expenditures of funds appropriated by the Council or under the custody of the City Treasurer, and all claims under the Illinois Worker's Compensation Act.
14. The *Committee on Health* shall have jurisdiction over health and sanitation matters affecting general health care, control of specific diseases, mental health and alcoholism, food, nutrition, and the environment and matters affecting the Department of Health, the Department of Rodent Control and Commission for the Rehabilitation of Persons.
15. The *Committee on Housing and Neighborhood Development* shall have jurisdiction over all housing, redevelopment and neighborhood conservation matters and programs (except the building code), City planning activities, development and conservation, matters generally affecting the Chicago Plan Commission, the City's housing agencies and the Department of Planning, City and Community Development.
16. The *Committee on Human Rights and Consumer Protection* shall have jurisdiction over matters relating to human rights, consumer protection, product liability and consumer fraud, and matters relating to the Department of Law and the Department of Consumer Services.
17. The *Committee on Intergovernmental Relations* shall have jurisdiction over federal and state legislation and administrative regulations in which the City may have an interest or by which it may be affected. The Committee shall also have the jurisdiction to conduct oversight operations of all City of Chicago activities, investigate improper conduct by City personnel, and recommend to the City Council such actions it deems necessary.
18. The *Committee on Land Acquisition and Disposition* shall have jurisdiction over all acquisitions and dispositions of interest in real estate by the City, its agencies and departments. The committee's jurisdiction also includes all other acquisitions or dispositions of interest in real estate which the City Council is required to approve under state or federal law.
19. The *Committee on Leases* shall have jurisdiction over all leases of real estate, or of space within buildings, to which the City, or any of its agencies, departments or officers, is a party.
20. The *Committee on License* shall have jurisdiction over the licensing of persons, property, businesses and occupations and matters generally affecting the Department of Revenue.
21. The *Committee on Streets and Alleys* shall have jurisdiction over all orders, ordinances and resolutions affecting street naming and layout, the City map, privileges in public ways, special assessments, and matters generally affecting the Bureau of Maps and Plats or other agencies dealing with street and alley patterns and elevation, and the Board of Local Improvements.

22. The *Committee on Local Transportation* shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to the Chicago Transit Authority, the subways, and the furnishing of public transportation within the City by any and all means of conveyance.
23. The *Committee on Municipal Code Revision* shall have jurisdiction over the recodification, revision, rearrangement and clarification of the Chicago Municipal Code. The Committee shall review the Code and from time to time recommend non-substantive changes, and repeal of archaic or unnecessary ordinances. The committee shall be responsible for supervising the periodic updating of the Code. The committee may recommend substantive changes in the Code, or in portions thereof, but shall in each case identify such changes in its report to the Council.
24. The *Committee on Police, Fire and Municipal Institutions* shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to the Police Department, the Fire Department and municipal institutions.
25. The *Committee on Ports, Wharves and Bridges* shall have jurisdiction over all matters relating to ports, wharves, bridges, and the Chicago Regional Port District.
26. The *Committee on Public Utilities* shall have jurisdiction over all ordinances, orders, resolutions and matters affecting public utilities with the exception of those matters over which jurisdiction is conferred herein upon the Committee on Local Transportation.
27. The *Committee on Special Events and World's Fair* shall have jurisdiction over all special events and related programs of the City, including parades, fests, tastes, community and neighborhood fairs, and the World's Fair.
28. The *Committee on Traffic Control and Safety* shall have jurisdiction over all orders, ordinances, resolutions and matters relating to the regulating vehicular and pedestrian traffic, on or off street parking, public safety, super-highways, grade separations, Chicago metropolitan area traffic studies and highway development, and matters generally affecting the Bureau of Street Traffic and the Bureau of Parking, the police Traffic Bureau, and public and private organizations dealing with traffic.
29. The *Committee on Zoning* shall have jurisdiction over all zoning matters and the operation of the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Department of Zoning."

Rule 38 is changed to read as follows:

"Whenever any referred matter shall not have been reported back to the City Council by the committee to which referred, within a period of sixty (60) days, the chairman of the committee shall at the written request of the sponsor of the matter submit a report in writing to the Council at its next regular meeting, giving a brief summary of the proceedings had in said committee in relation to such referred matter and stating the reasons for the failure or inability of the committee to report such referred matter back to the Council together with any conclusion thereon to such time.

At the end of each calendar quarter, each committee shall submit a summary report of its activities during such quarter, which shall identify all matters referred to the committee, all matters referred to subcommittees, hearings held on each referred matter, and reports and recommendations made by the committee.

Whenever any referred matter shall not have been reported back to the City Council by the committee to which referred, within a period of ninety (90) days, any alderman may move to discharge the committee from further consideration of that matter. The motion to discharge shall be made under the order of "Miscellaneous Business", and shall require the affirmative vote of 2/3 of all the Aldermen entitled to law to be elected. Upon the demand of any two

Aldermen, a motion to discharge a matter from a standing committee shall be deferred to the next meeting of the Council. In the case of a special committee, the acceptance of a final report, or the discharge from the committee of its entire subject matter, by the Council shall terminate the special committee unless the Council otherwise provides."

Rule 39 is changed, in the fourth paragraph thereof, said fourth paragraph to read as follows:

"One-half (1/2) of the total number of members of each standing committee (excepting from such total the *ex officio* members) shall constitute a quorum; a majority of the members appointed to each special committee and sub-committee which may be created shall constitute a quorum of such special committee or sub-committee. However, a quorum of the Committee on Finance shall be fifteen (15) members."

Rule 41 is changed by deleting everything after the first paragraph.

Rule 44 is changed by substituting for the last paragraph thereof the following:

"Each committee report recommending action by the City Council shall be presented to the Council by the Chairman of the committee or by any other member of the committee designated by the Chairman. At such time, the Chairman or member presenting the report may have up to five (5) minutes for the purpose of explaining the report, notwithstanding a motion or demand to defer and publish.

If a committee report recommends that the Council adopt or pass an ordinance, resolution, or order, the report may be taken up and acted upon after its presentation, subject to deferral by appropriate action.

If a committee report recommends that the Council do not adopt or pass an ordinance, resolution, or order at the time such report is presented, or at the next meeting of the Council if action on such report is deferred, such ordinance, resolution, order or directive shall be automatically tabled and may not be further considered, unless the sponsor at such time moves to disapprove the committee report and such motion is adopted by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the Aldermen entitled by law to be elected. Such motion may be deferred only until the next regular meeting of the Council, and may not be renewed thereafter. If such motion is duly adopted, the ordinance, resolution, or order shall be before the Council.

A committee may report a substitute for ordinances, resolutions, and orders referred to it, and such substitute shall be reported with a "do pass" recommendation. Such committee report shall identify the matters referred to it for which its recommendation substitutes, and all such matters shall be deemed recommended "do not pass".

Rule 46 is changed, by substituting for the first four paragraphs thereof, the following:

"Ordinances, resolutions and orders may be introduced only by Aldermen, except as is otherwise provided in these Rules or by ordinance or law for introductions by the Mayor, by filing three copies with the City Clerk during a meeting of the Council.

All such matters introduced shall be typed or printed on 8-1/2 x 11 inch paper (or printed) and the pages thereof shall be numbered. Each matter introduced shall identify the sponsoring Alderman, or the Mayor where applicable, and may identify additional Aldermen as co-sponsors. All ordinances which propose to amend any section of the Municipal Code of Chicago or any general or special ordinance shall indicate all language or figures to be added to the existing ordinance by underlining such addition, but language or figures to be omitted or repealed need not be specifically indicated.

Upon introduction, the City Clerk shall assign a sequential number to each proposed ordinance, resolution, and order in accordance with a sequential numbering system for each type of such legislation established by the Clerk with the approval of the Committee on Committees and Rules. Each amendment to a pending ordinance, resolution or order shall similarly be numbered sequentially upon introduction, whether introduced in committee or in the Council, by reference to the number of the document proposed to be amended. Sequential numbering shall also apply to amendments. The City Clerk shall maintain continuous and up-to-date records of all matters introduced, and their status, and shall regularly report on such status, all of which shall be public records.

Ordinances, resolutions or orders shall be promptly reproduced by the City Clerk, upon introduction, in sufficient quantities for distribution to each alderman, each elected City officer, the Law Department, the City Council Legislative Reference Bureau, each department or agency of the City affected thereby, and for a reasonable number of copies to be available to the public in the City Clerk's office. Upon their adoption, the same publication requirement shall apply to amendments.

No ordinance, resolution or order, or amendment thereto, may be voted upon for adoption or passage, by the Council or by any committee, until copies have been made available to the Aldermen in attendance at such meeting.

After passage or adoption by the City Council, ordinances, resolutions, and orders shall be printed in full in the Journal of the Proceedings; provided that resolutions, and orders which are routine as to form and which may readily and completely be abstracted need not be printed in full but may be so abstracted by the City Clerk in the Journal, unless the Council directs publication in full."

Rule 49 is changed, by adding the following to the proviso:

"by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the Aldermen entitled by law to be elected."

On motion of Alderman Burke, the foregoing proposed resolution was *Adopted*, by yeas and nays as follows:
