Call to Order.

On Tuesday, July 2, 1985, at 5:22 P.M. (the hour appointed for the meeting was 2:30 P.M.) Honorable Harold Washington, Mayor, called the meeting to order. Daniel J. Rules Suspended -- REPROGRAMMING OF YEAR X COMMUNITY
DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT SALVAGE FUNDS AND
EMERGENCY JOBS ACT FUNDS, FOR PAYMENT
OF GOVERNMENTAL EXPENSES, ETC.

Honorable Harold Washington, Mayor, submitted the following communication:

To the Honorable, The City Council of the City of Chicago:

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN -- At the request of the Budget Director, I transmit herewith, for your immediate consideration, an ordinance authorizing the continuation of Community Development Block Grant funded programs for the period July 2, 1985, through July 16, 1985, and reprogramming the necessary money from available Community Development Block Grant salvage funds.

Your favorable consideration of this ordinance will be appreciated.

Alderman Evans moved to *Suspend the Rules Temporarily* to permit immediate consideration of and action upon the said proposed ordinance transmitted with the foregoing communication.

In response to a request by Alderman Vrdolyak, Mayor Washington directed the Council to Stand at Ease.

At 6:45 P.M. Mayor Washington called the Council to order and asked the clerk to take the roll on Alderman Evans' motion. The motion *Prevailed* by yeas and nays as follows:

Nays -- Alderman Majerczyk -- 1. Alderman Evans then moved to amend the call for the special meeting by deleting the dates of "July 2, 1985, through and including July 16, 1985" and inserting the dates "July 1, 1985, through and including July 15, 1985," in lieu thereof and to make the matter *nunc pro tunc* July 1, 1985. The motion *Prevailed*.

Alderman Burke then moved to amend the proposed ordinance by deleting the language "and which were recommended for funding in C.D.B.G. Year XI Ordinance introduced by the Mayor at the special meeting of the City Council on June 20, 1985," appearing in Section 1. The motion *Prevailed*.

Thereupon, on motion of Alderman Evans, the said proposed ordinance was *Passed* as amended, by yeas and nays as follows:

Nays -- None.

Alderman Stemberk moved to reconsider the foregoing vote. The motion was lost.

The following is said ordinance as passed:

WHEREAS, An Ordinance Authorizing Submission of Final Statement of Objectives and Projected Use of Funds for C.D.B.G. Entitlement to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Year XI ("C.D.B.G. Year XI Ordinance") for the program year beginning July 1, 1985, has not been passed; and

WHEREAS, The programs and services funded under the C.D.B.G. Year X Appropriation Ordinance will terminate on June 30, 1985 by virtue of the C.D.B.G. Year X Appropriation Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, The public health, safety and welfare of Chicagoans will be protected by the uninterrupted provision of the C.D.B.G. funded programs and services pending the passage and approval of the C.D.B.G. Year XI Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and the City Council deem it desirable to continue the C.D.B.G. funded programs and services; and

WHEREAS, The City's C.D.B.G. Year XI program is considered to begin on July 1, 1985, by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development regardless of the actual date on which the City submits the Final Statement of Objectives and Projected Use of Funds for C.D.B.G. Entitlement for Year XI; and

WHEREAS, Program costs incurred prior to the award of the C.D.B.G. Year XI Entitlement are not eligible to be paid from the C.D.B.G. Year XI Entitlement; and

WHEREAS, Salvage (unspent C.D.B.G. funds from prior years) has been identified in the C.D.B.G. Year XI Ordinance; now, therefore,

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. All programs, including those provided by Contractor/Delegate Agencies, funded under the C.D.B.G. Year X Appropriation Ordinance are authorized to operate from July 1, 1985 through July 15, 1985.

SECTION 2. These said programs are allocated funds for fifteen days from July 1, 1985, through July 15, 1985, not to exceed the pro rated equivalent of the C.D.B.G. funds which the said programs individually were appropriated under the C.D.B.G. Year X Appropriation Ordinance including funds authorized through separate reprogrammings as approved by the City Council, or C.D.B.G. allocations approved under the 1983 Emergency Jobs Bill Act for the period July 1, 1984, through June 30, 1985. Said programs and allocations are identified in Exhibit A which is hereby made a part of this Ordinance and is incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 3. Funds for this allocation for the period July 1, 1985, through July 15, 1985, will be reprogrammed from C.D.B.G. salvage funds included in the C.D.B.G. Year XI Substitute Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The terms and conditions of employment effective on June 30, 1985, relating to each employee of the City of Chicago whose position is included in Exhibit A shall be in effect during the period July 1, 1985, through and including July 15, 1985.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be effective from and after July 1, 1985, and shall continue in full force and effect through and including July 15, 1985.

Adjournment.

Alderman Burke moved that the City Council do *Adjourn*. The motion *Prevailed* and the City Council stood *Adjourned*.
